Use wool or rubber dryer balls in the clothes dryer to reduce drying time and static.

Wool dryer balls can also absorb extra moisture. These are an efficient alternative to dryer sheets, which can create buildup on the dryer's filter and reduce air circulation. If you prefer dryer sheets, scrub the filter once a month to remove buildup.

## **BOARD MEETING SUMMARY**

A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative was held both in-person and via teleconference on December 31, 2020 at 7:55 a.m. The following is a summary of the meeting activities. The agenda, minutes of the December 1, 2020 meeting, new and terminated memberships, monthly safety and compliance report, and estate capital credit retirements were approved.

#### Action Items

- a. Monthly Financial Statements and Reports were approved. Finance Committee reviewed checks written and the board and CEO expenses.
- b. The board approved the 2020 write-off of uncollectable debt from 2019 in the amount of \$27,102.78.
- c. The board approved holding the November 2021 board meeting on Tuesday, November 30, 2021 due to the Thanksgiving holiday on Thursday, November 25, 2021.

- d. The board approved the new Board Policy No. 409 West Riverside Energy Center Internal Accounting, regarding the accounting of CWEC's partial ownership of West Riverside Energy Center.
- e. The board reviewed the proposed 2021 Budget and Goals in detail and approved as presented.

Operations and Engineering – Recognition was given to two operations employees regarding their handling of a vehicle accident that occurred while on a job site. The history of our underground locating service was discussed.

Accounting and Finance – Financial reports were reviewed.

Member Services – Ms. Mazemke reported Toys For Tots is wrapped up for 2020 with approximately 1,100 children receiving toys. The staff was thanked for their help in making this year a huge success.

President and CEO – Mike Wade, CEO, reported on his submitted report.

# **BUSS REFLECTS ON 20 YEARS ON CWEC BOARD OF DIRECTORS**



fter serving on the Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative's Board of Directors for the past 20 years, Anthony Buss, Jr. is retiring from the board.

Buss was first appointed to the board in 2001, and has served as the chairman of the board since 2009. Prior to that, he had served as a District Committeeman for

CWEC for around 15 years.

The cooperative way of life was instilled in Buss early, as he grew up on a family farm that was a member of different cooperatives. He eventually took over the farm, and joined a couple of other cooperatives.

"Growing up with cooperatives in the family, I guess it just sort of rubbed off on me," Buss said.

With his background in cooperatives, and his time serving as a committeeman, is was easy for Buss to agree to be a director on the CWEC board when he was asked.

Buss said he didn't have any specific goals once he joined the board because, as he put it, "you have to get your feet wet for quite a while."

Moving the co-op to a new headquarters building was something Buss had his eye on since his time as a District Committeeman.

"One of my goals was to have a new headquarters, because the one in Iola was very antiquated," Buss said.

That goal was realized in 2011.

"It's a building now that other co-ops, when we built it,

other co-ops came and looked at it, and they used us as a model," Buss said. "A guy gets pretty proud of what we have in Rosholt."

Buss said another accomplishment was getting CWEC to gain partial ownership of the West Riverside Energy Center located near Beloit when it was recently constructed.

"It's supposed to benefit the (CWEC) members and we're just starting to see it (benefits) a little bit on our bills now," Buss said.

His proudest accomplishment doesn't involve the construction of a new building or plant, though.

"If I ever got a question or complaint from a member, I tried to get them an answer and get the problem solved as quick as possible," he said. "That's probably the thing I'm most proud of and the thing I've done throughout my career."

Citing health issues, Buss said the time is right to retire from the board.

"I think the most enjoyable part of being a director is the camaraderie you develop with your other directors," Buss said. "I think within the last 9–10 years the board of directors has stayed the same, so you get to know everybody very personally, and you almost develop a family, especially with your directors and some of the employees. Not only is the camaraderie on a local level, but it's also on a state and national level when you go to meetings you have to attend."

Buss said his retirement from the board will allow him to spend more time with his family and see his grandchildren more.

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# OPPOR HAS FOND MEMORIES OF HIS TIME WITH CWEC



fter more than 40 years with Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative, first as an employee, and then as a board director, Leonard Oppor is retiring from the board.

Prior to becoming a director on the board, Oppor worked for the co-op for 30 years, retiring as a lineman in 2001.

It was his time at the co-op as a lineman that eventually led him to seek election to become a director in 2009.

"I wanted to find out what goes on in the office. I was a lineman and I never got into the office part," Oppor said.

His time spent as a lineman with CWEC proved to be beneficial for himself, as well as other members of the board.

"The rest of the board was asking me questions about things that took place out in the field, and I could answer them," Oppor said.

It was also Oppor's time as a lineman that helped form his goals for his time as a director on the board. He knew what linemen endured out in the field and he wanted to make sure they had equipment needed to do the job efficiently.

"I wanted to push for a new bucket truck," Oppor said

about one of the first items of equipment he pushed for. "We had an old one we were using."

When Oppor was first elected to the board, the CWEC headquarters was located in Iola. Moving the headquarters to a new building in Rosholt was cited by Oppor as one of the accomplishments he is proud of when looking back at his time on the board.

"That was one of our accomplishments as a board, not just mine," Oppor added.

Even though Oppor said he didn't enjoy the traveling aspect of it, he did enjoy attending meetings throughout the country.

"We'd get to visit with other board members and bring that information back to our board," he said. "I thought that was pretty interesting."

Oppor said he made a lot of friends during his time as a director, but part of his decision to not seek re-election was an effort to get "new blood" on the board. He added that more people should try being on the board.

"New ideas don't hurt," he said.

Spending more time with his family is one of the things Oppor said he is looking forward to in retirement.

The recipient will need to provide CWEC with a copy of their grades and proof of enrollment for the second semester.







#### **BUSINESS MEETING: 6 P.M.**

entral Wisconsin Electric Cooperative (CWEC) will be hosting a virtual annual meeting on Tuesday, April 27, 2021, at 6 p.m.

CWEC had hoped it would be able to return to its traditional in-person annual meeting in 2021, but due to the continued presence of COVID-19, the CWEC Board of Directors has chosen to hold a virtual annual meeting. The decision was made for the safety of CWEC members and employees.

This year's virtual annual meeting will be held in a similar fashion as the virtual annual meeting that was held in 2020. The virtual annual meeting will be open to CWEC members only.

Two director positions on the CWEC board are up for election. Both incumbents for those positions, District 1 Anthony Buss, Jr. and District 2 Leonard Oppor, have decided to not run for re-election. Prior to the annual meeting, members in the districts that Buss and Oppor represent will receive a director election mailing from CWEC with instruction on how to cast their vote.

All CWEC members will receive information through the mail about the virtual annual meeting, including how to register for the meeting and how to log in.

During the virtual annual meeting, President & CEO Mike Wade and Board Chairman Anthony Buss, Jr. will keynote the meeting's business session, which begins at 6 p.m. During the business session, members will have the opportunity to hear how their co-op is faring financially, learn details about various services offered by their member-owned power supplier, and receive updates on state and federal regulatory issues of importance to electric co-ops. The results of the election of two board positions will also be announced.

A bill credit will be given to all members who attend virtually. In addition, additional bill credits will be given away as door prizes. For all of the drawings, winners need to be present throughout the entire meeting.
