(CPI). The cost of medical care increased 3% during this time, and education was not too far behind at 2.6%. So, where did electricity rank? According to the CPI, electricity increased by less than half a percentage point, 0.4%.

Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative will be hosting a virtual annual meeting on Thursday, Aug. 13, 2020, at 6 p.m.

When the original annual meeting that was scheduled for April 21 was postponed due to the COVID-19 pandemic it was hoped that it could be rescheduled for a future date and still be held inperson. Due to the continued impact of COVID-19, the CWEC Board of Directors opted to pursue hosting a virtual meeting for the safety our members and employees.

### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS ELECTION**

Three CWEC Board of Directors elections were scheduled to take place when the original annual meeting was scheduled in April. Because we were unable to host that meeting, the current directors have continued to fill those roles until the annual meeting could be rescheduled and held. The results for the three elections will take place at the virtual annual meeting on August 13.

#### **DOOR PRIZES**
