BOARD MEETING SUMMARY

A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative was held at the headquarters in Rosholt at 8:06 a.m. on September 26, 2019. The following is a summary of the meeting activities. The agenda, minutes of the August 29, 2019 meeting, new and terminated memberships, and the monthly safety and compliance report were approved.

Action Items

- a. Monthly Financial Statements and Reports were approved. Finance Committee reviewed checks written and the board and CEO expenses.
- b. The board reviewed information from our attorney regarding joint memberships held as tenancy in common vs. joint tenancy. Discussion will continue at the October meeting.
- c. The board reviewed an email received from Adams-Columbia Electric Cooperative regarding Badger Power Cooperative. Discussion was held regarding the issue and our reply.
- d. Mike Wade gave an overview of the final three action items the management staff has been working on for the 2020-2022 strategic goals. October's meeting will recap all the strategic goals, action items, who will be responsible for them, and a due date for completion.
- e. The board approved retiring \$325,000 in capital credits. Members will see credits on their electric bill if the amount is less than \$100, then a refund check will be mailed.
- f. The board selected Directors Buss, Lehrer, and Onesti to attend the WECA Annual Meeting in Stevens Point on November 5-6, 2019. Director Buss was selected as the WECA voting delegate and Director

Onesti was selected as the voting delegate for the Federated Youth Foundation.

- g. The board reviewed the 2020 NRECA/CFC/CoBank conference schedule and selected which directors will attend each conference for the year. Voting and alternate delegates were also selected for the conferences where needed.
- h. The board agreed to continue investing in American Transmission Company (ATC) as part of the fourth capital call of 2019.
- i. Mike Wade presented the board with the results of the survey of other Wisconsin cooperatives and how they have named their fixed monthly fees. This will be discussed further at the October meeting.

Operations and Engineering - Kevin Kurtzweil reported his department is very busy with new connects. Since Damage Prevention Services is no longer doing locating for us, we have been doing them in-house, giving our crews experience in this area.

Accounting and Finance - Mike Wade reported that Lila Shower was attending the NISC-MIC Conference in St. Louis, where she was a presenter this year.

Member Services - Brenda Mazemke reported the cooperative calendars will be handed out at the Member Appreciation Breakfast. The Member Advisory Group (MAG) meeting was held last week with good attendance.

President and CEO - Mr. Wade reported on his submitted report.

Chairman and Directors - Directors reported on the NRECA regional meeting, the JT&S committee meeting, the Member Advisory Group meeting, and the WECA Cooperative Governance Challenges workshop.

Meeting adjourned at 1:41 p.m.



Yarbrough makes a difference in Juatemala

n September 30, Mack Yarbrough, operations crew leader for Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative, and 11 other volunteer linemen from Wisconsin, Illinois, and Iowa embarked on a journey to Guatemala to help families in a rural village get electricity for the very first time. The trip was part of the Partners for a Brighter Tomorrow project.

"I thought it would be pretty cool as a milestone in my career," Yarbrough said about why he volunteered for the trip. Yarbrough said he was also fully aware that the work to bring electricity to the remote village of Salinas 7 Cerros would be challenging. Making the work tougher was the fact the linemen would not be able to use bucket trucks to get to the top of the poles.

"We have to climb every pole, drill holes, put all the hardware on, and then we have to put dolleys on them to pull the wire through," Yarbrough said prior to the trip. "Then we'll have to go and tie it in. There is going to be a lot of climbing." The desire to help those in need made the decision to head to Guatemala an easy one for Yarbrough.

"It's going to be a lot of fun to go build lines over there, just in general, that's why I'm in this career because I enjoy that," Yarbrough said prior to the trip. "...It will be quite an experience. And I think it will be a humbling experience."

After returning home after roughly three weeks in Guatemala, Yarbrough confirmed that the experience was humbling.

"It makes you feel kind of guilty the way we live here compared to how they have it," Yarbrough said.

He added, "They (village residents) are very happy. They

are just so genuine, which was really nice to see."

He said residents happily invited the linemen into their homes to do the electric installation.

"Everyone was very good to us," Yarbrough said. "They don't have much, but anything that they did have I think they would have given us. But they helped us, and that's how I knew that they were very receptive to us."

Yarbrough added, "The goal of everybody (linemen) there was we were just hoping to make their (villagers) lives easier. They work all day just to survive. They have a hard road. We're pretty pampered here in America."

And when the light switches were turned on for the first time, Yarbrough said residents were all smiles and gave the linemen a thumbs up.

Yarbrough said seeing the residents get electricity for the first time was more satisfying than he thought it would be. "I was smiling probably more than them," Yarbrough said. "I'm just hoping to make their lives a little easier."

Yarbrough confirmed that there was a lot of climbing, and that all the linemen did their fair share of climbing and other work.

"It was all very evenly distributed," Yarbrough said. "We climbed every pole a couple of times. The work itself wasn't bad, but it was just the heat that made it a little harder."

As precautions against the sun and the heat, Yarbrough said plenty of sunscreen was used, as well as cooling towels, and the linemen kept an eye on each other.

The trip wasn't all work for the linemen. Through donations, the linemen were able to provide children in the village with shoes, as well as soccer balls. Water filtration systems were also donated to residents. The CWEC Board of Directors and employees donated \$500 toward the purchase of the water filtration systems, which cost around \$50 each.

"We're definitely making a big impact because they don't have clean drinking water," Yarbrough said. "I'm hoping this has a big impact on their health."

Looking back, Yarbrough said he is glad that he made the trip to Guatemala and he hopes someone else has this type of opportunity in the future.
