Shifting to off-peak periods

Electric rates based on time of use offer co-op members the ability to lower their electricity costs without reducing the amount of electricity used. By performing some of your daily chores such as running the dishwasher or doing laundry during offpeak hours (when people are using less electricity), you can see meaningful savings on your energy bills.

Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative (CWEC) Use your programmable thermostat to adjust the settings so that your heating and air conditioning systems sync with the off-peak rate periods. Use automatic timers to run hot tubs, pool pumps, water heaters and other appliances in the same way. Be sure to program the timers to coincide with the less expensive off-peak times.


Lastly, if you have recently purchased a new energy efficient appliance or product, make sure you are taking advantage of any special offers or rebates that are available.
