# **BOARD MEETING SUMMARY**

A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative was held at the headquarters in Rosholt at 8 a.m. on June 21, 2017. The following is a summary of the meeting activities. The agenda, minutes of the May 25, 2017, meeting, new and terminated memberships, and the monthly safety report were approved.

Action Items

- a. Monthly Financial Statements and Reports were approved. Finance Committee reviewed checks written, and the board and CEO expenses.
- b. Governance Committee approved changes to Chapter 4.0 Billings, Payment and Special Charges, and Policy 108 - Director Election (Addendum) was approved.
- c. The board reviewed progress made in each department on the board-approved goals of 2017.
- d. The board approved a revision to our qualifying facility electric rate for small hydro facilities.
- e. Directors' attendance at the WECA Emerging Energy Issues Summit in Stevens Point on August 15, 2017, was approved.
- f. The board discussed finding a replacement member for the 2018 Nominations Committee to fill the position held by a member in sub-district 2(c). Sub-district townships include: Amherst, Scandinavia, St. Lawrence, Lanark, and Farmington.

- g. The board discussed the service availability fee for members with multiple meters.
- h. VP of operations and the line manager presented guidelines being developed for large-scale outage restoration.
- i. The board agreed to continue investing in ATC as part of the third capital call of 2017.

Operations and Engineering - Completed total system overhead line inspection. Started underground inspection and CT meter inspection. Congratulations to Gabriel Pospyhalla and Quinton Zdroik on their completion of Apprenticeship School-they have reached journeyman lineman status as of June 5, 2017.

Accounting and Finance - Negative PCA for our June billing (May usage). Cannon technicians provided software updates and worked in the field on several meter communications issues.

Member Services -We have seven students registered to attend this year's Youth Leadership Congress this July at UW-River Falls. We have two employee chaperones attending the event with the group.

President and CEO Report - Continue working on our existing line extension policy. Following a change to the Dairyland Power Cooperative bylaws, the Class B membership category has been removed.

Directors reported on WECA Board Meeting, WECA Education and Finance Committee Meetings, the Dairyland Annual Meeting, and CFC Forum they attended.

## **CWEC ASSISTS DETERT FARM UPGRADE**

Partnering with its statewide organization, Wisconsin Electric Cooperative Association, Central Wisconsin Electric Co-op (CWEC) was able to provide over \$4,000 in grant funds to Cody Detert to help pay for electrical upgrades to his farm. Wisconsin electric



cooperatives, including CWEC, have developed a uniform statewide farm rewiring program entitled Safety First. The program's purpose is to assist dairy farmers with the cost of rewiring projects and to promote safety. Funding for this program comes from Wisconsin electric cooperatives.

Cody recently restarted the dairy operation of the 150-acre family farm located in the Marion area. The dormant portion of the farm was in need of some TLC, so Cody contracted with Olson's Rural Electric of Clintonville to do the work, which included a service upgrade; hookup of feeding equipment, fans, and milking equipment; and upgrading old farm lighting to energy efficient light-emitting diodes (LEDs).

"We're pleased to assist Cody in making these needed upgrades to the farm," said CWEC Vice President of Member Relations Mark Forseth. "We're always excited to see a young person carry on a family business. We wish Cody all the best."

Cody indicated he's already planning to expand his 60cow herd.
