CWEC & COBANK SUPPORT THE ROSHOLT FIRE DISTRICT

Central Wisconsin Electric Co-op, along with one of its financial partners, CoBank, donated \$2,000 to the Rosholt Fire District. The funds will be used to purchase a portable watering tank.

Through a program CoBank offers cooperatives called Sharing Success, Central Wisconsin Electric Co-op had the opportunity to apply for grant funds on behalf of an area nonprofit organization. To be eligible for the grant the co-op has to commit to match the amount of the grant application, which in this case was \$1,000.

"The toughest part of the process was to choose just one of the many terrific area nonprofit organizations," said Co-op Vice President Mark Forseth. "The fire department does a magnificent job of protecting the Rosholt area while operating on a very tight budget, so we feel they're an excellent choice."

The Rosholt Fire District provides fire protection to the Village of Rosholt, Town of Alban, and Town of Sharon.

This is the fourth time CWEC and

CoBank have partnered to assist nonprofit organizations. Previous recipients were the Bowler Fire Department, Iola Fire & Ambulance Departments, and the Birnamwood Fire District.

"As part of our ongoing commitment to the communities we serve, it gives us great pleasure to provide the funds for the purchase of this much needed equipment," said CWEC CEO Mike Wade.
