PLENTY TAKING PLACE AS WE APPROACH THE HOLIDAY SEASON

Many of you are counting the days (if not the hours and minutes) until the beginning of

At their October meeting, the board of directors approved the retirement of capital credits in the amount of \$350,000. Capital credits are the margins distributed to the members of the cooperative based on their energy purchases from the cooperative in previous years. The capital credit retirement this year will be made by applying 70% of the retirement to the oldest year on record and 30% of the retirement to more recent years. This method provides a fair retirement rotation and allows us to clear older years off the books. If your capital credits were part of the retirement, you will have noticed a credit on your electric bill or have received a check in the mail. As the cooperative is financially able, it is a privilege to return a portion of your investment in the cooperative to you.

One of the best and most rewarding community service programs we participate in is the Toys for Tots program. Your generous donations have put smiles on the faces of thousands of children since the program began. With Christmas just around the corner, our Toys for Tots campaign has begun. BOARD MEETING SUMMARY

The August regular meeting of the Board of Directors of Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative was held inperson on August 26, 2021 at 7:55 a.m. The following is a summary of the meeting activities. The agenda, minutes of the July 29, 2021 meeting, new and terminated memberships, monthly safety and compliance report, and estate capital credit retirements were approved.

Action Items

- Monthly Financial Statements and Reports were approved. Finance Committee reviewed checks written and the board and CEO expenses.
- b. The board approved the proposed changes to Board Policy 106 – Director Education as presented by the Governance Committee.
- c. The board reviewed Board Policy 108 Director Election and Addendum with no recommended changes.
- d. The board approved a new revolving loan application.
- e. Amanda Seger from CFC presented the 2020 Key Ratio

Trend Analysis (KRTA) to the board.

f. Mr. Kurtzweil and Ms. Hardel gave an informational presentation to the board on the new program for the replacement of unjacketed underground cable.

Operations and Engineering – Mr. Kurtzweil reported his crews are very busy since the storms a couple weeks ago. The Almon substation will be back fed starting September 7 for a few days for Alliant to do some work and Energis to do maintenance.

Accounting and Finance – Financial reports were reviewed.

Member Services – Ms. Mazemke reported there were 65 submissions for the calendar photo contest this year. A team of employees will be selecting the winning photos in the next week so the calendar can be printed in time for the Member Appreciation Breakfast on October 30, 2021. Bert Lehman was selected as the new secretary/treasurer for the Wisconsin REC Member Services Association.

CO-OP RETIRES \$350,000 IN CAPITAL CREDITS

One of the benefits of being a member of Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative (CWEC) is that members are eligible to receive capital credits, which represent your ownership in CWEC.

Unlike investor-owned utilities that maximize profits to pay dividends to shareholders, CWEC, which is a not-for-profit electric cooperative, provides our members with "at cost" electric service. We do not exist to earn a profit.

When each year's finances are audited and closed out, the remaining profit or margins are allocated to the members based on the amount each member paid for electricity during the year in the form of capital credits. These capital credits are used by the co-op to help build and maintain the CWEC electric system. When the co-op's finances permit, the board of directors approves a portion of the allocated capital credits to be retired, and paid back to you—the members.

This year, the board of directors approved the retirement of \$350,000 in capital credits. That amount was divided as follows: 70% of the \$350,000 for members with capital credits from 1993 and prior years; 30% distributed to members with capital credits from

lines for six years or longer receive retired capital credits.

Active members whose retired capital credits were less than \$100 received a credit on their September electric bill, which was mailed to members in October. Checks were mailed in October to active members whose retired capital credits amounted to more than \$100. Checks, with a minimum of \$10, were also mailed to all past members who received retired capital credits.

CWEC has returned more than \$5.7 million to its member-owners.

Allocation vs. Retirement

An **allocation** is made annually for each member, based upon the amount of electricity you purchased the previous year. An allocation is your share of the amount of net margins CWEC sets aside into a separate account to be used as operating capital for reliability improvements and maintenance over a period of years. You typically receive notice of the amount allocated to your capital credit account on your April electric bill.

A **retirement** is the amount you receive back as a capital credit refund. It is a percentage of your total capital credit balance. The amount retired is decided annually by the board of directors.

Matt Schrank had already been a business owner in the village of Tigerton for 14 years when he made the decision to purchase another business in Tigerton— Cedar Street Market grocery store.

The grocery store was for sale and on the verge of being closed because the owner was retiring when Schrank purchased it in November 2020. With Schrank also owning Gage's Tire & Auto in Tigerton, he said it was convenient for him to shop at Cedar Street Market, but added part of the reason he purchased the store was to keep it in the community.

"For the older generation it's a lot more important (to have a grocery store in the community)," Schrank said. "For people who don't like to travel out of town."

He added that everybody in the community has been receptive to him being the new owner.

"Everybody who does shop here is appreciative," Schrank said.

Since purchasing Cedar Street Market, Schrank has made some changes, most notably adding more product to the store to provide customers with more choices.

"We are not a discount store anymore," said Rachel Marquardt, store manager at Cedar Street Market. "We are a full grocery store, getting in fresh meat cuts again, and having a full line of products."

Marquardt said business has progressively been increasing.

"People are starting to check us out, hearing that we are not a discount store," Marquardt said. "They are coming in to see what we have, and liking what we have to offer."

Marquardt said the goal is to add new products to the store as demand dictates, and to "keep business going and growing."

As stated, Schrank has been operating Gage's Tire & Auto in Tigerton since he purchased the auto garage in 2006.

"I was looking for something new," Schrank said about why he purchased the auto repair business. "I always liked and enjoyed working on cars."

Since purchasing Gage's Tire and Auto, Schrank said business has been great. He added that he is concentrating on servicing existing customers.

"We're busy enough that we really don't need to grow anymore," he said. "Just take care of the people."

He added, "Shout out to all the people and the local support. It's been a great community to work with."
