At the September CWEC Board of Directors meeting, the directors approved the retirement of capital credits in the amount of \$275,000. Capital credits are the margins distributed to the members of the CWEC based on their energy purchases from the cooperative in previous years. The capital credit retirement this year will be made by applying 70% of the retirement to the oldest year on record and 30% of the retirement to more recent years. This

method provides a fair retirement rotation and allows us to clear older years off the books. Giving back all profits the cooperative makes is one of the best things about being a co-op member.

One of the most beneficial and rewarding community service programs we participate in is the Toys for Tots program. Your generous donation of toys has put smiles on the faces of thousands of children since the program began. With Christmas just around the corner, our Toys for Tots campaign has begun. Energy EfficiencyTip of the Month



The holiday season is upon us, and that means we'll be using more energy in the kitchen. When possible, cook with smaller countertop appliances instead of the stovetop or oven. Smaller appliances like slow cookers, air fryers, and Instant Pots consume less energy.

When using the oven or stovetop, match the size of the pot to the heating element and place a lid over the pot while cooking. The food will cook faster, and you'll use less energy.

The August regular meeting of the Board of Directors of Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative was held on August 23, 2023 at 7:50 a.m. The following is a summary of the meeting activities. The agenda, minutes of the July 27, 2023 meeting, new and terminated memberships, monthly safety and compliance report, and estate capital credit retirements were approved.

Action Items

- a. Monthly Financial Statements and Reports were approved.
 Finance Committee reviewed checks written and the board,
 CEO and employee expenses.
- b. The board approved the following as presented from the Governance Committee's meeting.
 - DGA rate approval The new rate has been recommended for board approval.

- DGCOM rate approval the new rate has been recommended for board approval.
- c. The board approved the change to the DG Policy.

Operations – Kevin Kurtzweil reported on his submitted report.

Accounting and Finance –Stacy Claussen reported we currently have six members still disconnected from our last round of disconnects. The first 178 new AMI meters have been installed with more gateways and relays to be installed shortly. The software is working nicely.

Member Relations – Brenda Mazemke reported we currently have 84 entries in our photo contest; this is up from a total of 52 last year. We currently have 14 vendors so far for the Member Appreciation Breakfast. Nueske Meats is celebrating 90 years with an event on September 16, 2023.

President & CEO Report – Lila Shower reviewed her submitted CEO report.

CO-OP RETIRES \$275,000 IN CAPITAL CREDITS

WHAT ARE CAPITAL CREDITS?

One of the benefits of being a member of Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative (CWEC) is that members are eligible to receive capital credits, which represent your ownership in CWEC.

Unlike investor-owned utilities that maximize profits to pay dividends to shareholders, CWEC, which is a not-for-profit electric cooperative, provides our members with "at cost" electric service. We do not exist to earn a profit.

When each year's finances are audited and closed out, the remaining profit or margins are allocated to the members based on the amount each member paid for electricity during the year in the form of capital credits. These capital credits are used by the co-op to help build and maintain the CWEC electric system. When the co-op's finances permit, the Board of Directors approves a portion of the allocated capital credits to be retired, and paid back to you—the members.



This year, the board of directors approved the retirement of \$275,000 in capital credits. That amount was divided as follows: 70% of the \$275,000 went to members who had capital credits from 1993 and prior years; 30% went to members with capital credits from 1994 through 2018. All

members who have been on CWEC electric lines for six years or longer received retired capital credits.

Active members whose retired capital credits were less than \$100 received a credit on their September electric bill, which was mailed to members in October. Checks were mailed in October to active members whose retired capital credits amounted to more than \$100. Checks,

with a minimum of \$10, were also mailed to all off-line members who received retired capital credits.


