NEW METER SYSTEM ADVANCES PAST PILOT PROGRAM

The installation of a new meter system for Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative (CWECC) has advanced past the pilot program, as new meters are currently being installed throughout the CWECC territory.

Meters for the pilot program began to be installed in December of 2022 when 178 meters around the Iola substation were switched out to the new meters. Work for the pilot program was completed in August.



After all the meters for the pilot program were installed and found to be working properly, new meters began to be installed, expanding outward from the pilot program's geographical area.

LOAD MANAGEMENT PROGRAM FOR WATER HEATERS DISCONTINUED

Effective Jan. 1, 2024, Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative will be discontinuing its load management program for water heaters. By discontinuing the program, the need for co-op employees to enter the homes of its members will be eliminated.

A letter will be sent to CWEC members who are enrolled in the load management program for water heaters to notify them that the program is being discontinued. The letter will also include information about CWEC hiring a third-party to set-up appointments with members to have the load management receivers removed from their water heaters.

With the load management program ending, members who were enrolled in the load management program for water heaters will no longer receive a \$2 credit on their monthly electric bill.

Central Wisconsin Electric Cooperative's Commitment to Community Program is designed to help households with their energy costs, including electric bills. For many Wisconsin households, energy costs place a severe and continuing

stress on the family budget. To better serve our members, CWEC is part of the Wisconsin Home Energy Plus (HE+) program.
