The program consisted of more than 7,360 hours of on the job training, and 640 hours spent in paid-related instruction. With the completion of the program, Singer and Wick have now achieved the status of journey electric lineworker.



They were recognized at a graduation ceremony at the Kalahari Resort in Wisconsin Dells, where they received their graduate certificate.

NEED HELP PAYING YOUR ENERGY BILLS?

As spring approaches, the date in which utility companies can starting disconnecting customers and members for non-payment of their monthly bill, is also approaching. The end of the winter disconnection rules is April 15.

CWEC's Commitment to Community Program is designed to help households with their energy costs, including electric bills. For many Wisconsin households, energy costs place a severe and continuing stress on the family budget. To better serve our members, CWEC is part of the Wisconsin Home Energy Plus (HE+) program.

This program is funded through public benefits and federal dollars to help eligible low-income households pay for home energy assistance and weatherization. Members may be eligible if they meet the HE+ program guidelines. Members should contact their local agency to determine eligibility.


